The Workshop's sessions...

Minister Adel Cortas (ex-Minister of Agriculture)

presided the Official opening session by sponsors represented by Mr. George Nasrawi (Association of Lebanese Industrialists and Syndicate of Lebanese Food Industries), Ms Soha Atallah (LibanPack), & Mr. Nabil Gemayel (Gemayel Freres), Mr. Atef Idriss (MEFOSA) tackled some TBT & packaging concerns through some MENA case studies related to packaging's non conformities and the different national and



regional impediments that hinder local SME's market access. In the same session, Ms Caren Jabbour (MEFOSA) introduced TBT issues in packaging and labeling along with MEFOSA's activities, offerings and technologies to assure safe packaging and safe food. Ms Jana Majzoub (LibanPack) also presented opportunities for increasing exports with innovative food packaging solutions that can render foods safer.

The afternoon session was lead by Dr Gordon Robertson and presented the food contact material requirements in general including overall and

specific migration limits emphasizing on the differences between the EU and USA approach to FMCs.



On the second day, Ms Zuha Sakr (USAID Project) presented the World Trade Organization Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade and its implications on Packaging of Food Products under the support for



Lebanon's accession to the World Trade Organization program. The sessions continued with Dr Gordon's interventions on BADGE in can lacquers and BPA in plastics followed by the presentation of current issues on plasticizers and printing inks. The final presentation tackled current issues in recycled paper and board packaging and Dr Gordon's concluded by sharing some useful informational sites and references.
